Dear Parent/Guardian,

You are receiving this letter because your child meets the eligibility requirements for enrollment in the **Hamilton County Juvenile Court Traffic Diversion Program**. The goal of the program is to promote safe driving practices by providing additional education on traffic laws and safe driving behaviors.

In order to enroll in the diversion program you and your child <u>must appear</u> in Juvenile Court at the time and date specified on your hearing notification. Attached are copies of the Traffic Diversion enrollment forms that must be signed if you elect to enter the diversion program.

If you successfully complete the Traffic Diversion Program, the charge against you will be dismissed, you will not be adjudicated a traffic offender, and points will not be assessed to your BMV driving record.

Involvement in the program is completely voluntary; if you wish to opt out of the program please contact the Juvenile Court Traffic Clerk prior to the date specified on your notification to schedule a non-diversion plea hearing: 513-946-9420.

#### **Hamilton County Juvenile Traffic Diversion**

Once the diversion agreement is accepted, court will schedule a final 180 day diversion review hearing: **PRESENCE IS WAIVED** for this hearing as long as diversion requirements are met.

- 180 day requirement: \$200 Diversion fee is due.

- OR Pay in person at Juvenile Court.
- 180 day requirement: Remedial course completion.
  - The remedial course is scheduled/completed on your own time. You are responsible for submitting the certificate of completion to Caitlin Deters:

- 180 day requirement: No new charges.
  - You must not receive any new charges during your diversion period. We run a final record check (this includes any traffic moving violations, delinquency, adult, or out of county offenses)

\*If you fail to comply with any of the diversion requirements you must appear at your final 180 day review date. The diversion dismissal entry will be mailed to you after the final 180 day review date. If you have any questions about diversion please contact:
